President Phil then invited Hon member Col Jefferies to come forward and draw the winners of the five lucky door prizes.





Brian Thompson wrote: -

Hi Graeme,

Many thanks for the contact by Phil Cohen on my 80th birthday. I have attached a summary of my activities since leaving the bank together with a photo taken in 2020 when I was awarded Life Membership in Lions. I am living life to the fullest and never expected to turn eighty, given that I survived bowel cancer at 48.

I hope to get to the April meeting now I am free of most of my obligations.

Since retiring from the ANZ in February 2000 on health grounds, my wife Dell and I sold our Sydney home and bought a home in Ulladulla. The decision wasn't easy as I had multiple health problems which required me to return regularly to Sydney for treatment.

Since arriving in Ulladulla I have been a member of the Lions Club of Ulladulla Milton. Our club is very active in community projects. I became heavily involved with the formation of a community foundation (Lions Ulladulla District Community Foundation) whose charter is to provide accommodation for the disabled and disadvantaged. The foundation is unique, in that its membership comprises representatives of other service clubs, Rotary & Apex.

Our first project was to build a disability respite house which cost \$768K, we completed the project in 2018 within budget. The house is called "Jindelara Cottage". The foundation has just commenced a second project, to build another disability facility to provide permanently accommodation for the disabled including those who are severely disabled. The cost of this project is \$1.68 million and is already fully funded. I facilitated the first build but because of my deteriorating health have someone else facilitating the new build. We acquired land for the new project from the Shoalhaven City Council who sold us the end of a road which adjoined the Princes Highway but was closed off to traffic. The purchase price was \$1. I was awarded the "Lions Clubs International Presidents Medal" in 2019, for my involvement in the "Jindelara" project and Life Membership in Lions Clubs International in 2020. In 2020 I was also awarded the "R.J. White Service Award" for 2019 by the Westpac Group Alumni in recognition for my community service over an extended period. Because I served 26 years with Westpac before joining ANZ, I am a member of that group's retirees club in addition to ANZROC. I noticed recently that Allan Gibson OAM is also a member of both groups.

During the "Black Summer Bushfires" on the South Coast in January 2020, I was asked to administer a Lions recovery fund for victims of the fires between Nowra and Mogo and as far west as Braidwood. This entailed leading a large team of Lions who, together with myself were to visit the devastated areas and offer immediate relief to victims by purchasing goods with funds provided by Lions Clubs International Foundation and Australian Lions Foundation. In recognition of my involvement, I was awarded the Lions Clubs International, "Medal of Excellence "in 2021.

In 2001, I was also recognised by the NSW Government for my service over 50 years as a Justice if the Peace, although Covid prevented the presentation until 2022.

I play a little golf at the Mollymook Golf Club but spend a significant amount of time with medical appointments related to my Multiple Sclerosis and other ailments. The MS has severely impacted on my golf game; however, the exercise is mandatory for my wellbeing. I walk daily. Regards, Brian

My history in the ANZ Bank:

I commenced employment with ANZ at 2 Martin Place on 7/3/1960 and was sent to George and Liverpool Streets Training College, and then posted to Manly Branch for 4 years then to Dubbo, Wellington, Wollongong, Bega, Mudge, Bathurst, Orange, Muswellbrook, Wee Waa (Cotton Industry), Moree (as Agi Bureau) and finally to Tamworth doing insolvency with two Tamworth Solicitors and two Sydney Barristers. I retired from the Bank, took long service leave, and worked for Allan Nicholls and Co Chartered Accountants of Wagga Wagga, Dubbo, Tamworth, and Lismore for 2 1/2 years and 24 years ago retired with Georgia my wife to Macksville NSW, our hometown but of course knew no one.

Why I have listed my experiences, by living 40 years in different place and being the youngest in my family, all I have left is one cousin (85 years) and two 2nd cousins which I have seen once. Plus an Uncle to 3 child of my late Brother who live in Queensland.

Therefore, it is a great pleasure to receive the ROC each month to catch up on past work mates etc., who are really "my family" now.
