We have downsized now from eight old cars to just two and have attached a photo of each. The old one is a 1928 Essex, which I have owned since 1977.

It was made by Hudson Motors, an American company, and named after the English County of Essex to enhance Commonwealth sales. Close to one million were made between 1918 and 1932, when the name was changed to Terraplane.

The other car is a 1974 Matador X Coupe, made by American Motors (Rambler) as a Nascar racing car. Seventy right hand drive models were assembled in Australia by Australian Motor Industries in Melbourne, over three years from 1974 to 1977.

They were considered a luxury car, costing close to \$12,000 when a Holden Camaro and a Ford GT were selling for approx. \$6,000.


Thank you for bringing the news of Marj's sad passing to the ANZ retired officer's group. I had a call from Marj's sister Sue last week advising me of this too.
