



All-in-all, it was a happy group who all seemed to once again enjoy each other's company and the Cardiff RSL buffet."



Colin great effort to be still riding a push bike at your age.


Colin has also sent me the following article on his fathers and his original Union Bank and then ANZ career: -

I was born 1937 Mosman, dad was at S P&H. Casino was I think his first branch and we left when I think I was 5. I can just remember there, for instance he would feed caught flies to Chugerum a big green frog. We were on holiday at Shelly beach Ballina when requested to contact branch as he was transferred to Hay. We immediately went back and packed. Funny I can remember the coach with a duck back and driver would cart baggage up back ladder to top. They packed and caught train to Sydney then Hay. Mum sat up all way as sleepers reserved for troops. Dad had applied for service like has brothers but knocked back as essential services. Mum had my brother lan a month after she arrived.

Hay was in the grip of a 6-year drought that was affecting Australia's war effort. The cockies were in trouble, no saltbush no grass no sheep. I have wondered how they kept their essential dogs as there were no roos. Dad evidently was lending money unsecured for sugar flour etc. I can remember Mum putting the tablecloth over the plates of food in dust storms. When we had a few inches of rain Wally Rees of Chillichel came in and asked for the money to buy 500 sheep and when it continued another 500 this time twice the money. Through their children they are still friends. Somewhere in this mix Dad received an audit and I understand got, I am sorry John but I must report you for lending money unsecured. I guess there were a number. In my service in ANZ someone told me -

"Your Dad was in a lot of trouble down at Hay'. Now every banker knows that TIMING is the most important thing in life and Dad received a transfer from the small town of Hay to manager of the City of Wagga Wagga, then later to Parramatta where fortunately as no bank premises he purchased a house and I started high school.. I would like to add that I have enjoyed every minute of Union bank ANZ bank and beyond in life and now 86 still enjoying a ball and a beer but sometimes it's a red wine. Colin Stoner.





Colin also mentioned he read the latest NL and comments by Karl Mizens and said good article and knew him well. Colin thanks very much.


