Whilst Ken was not a member of ANZROC(NSW), he would be very well known to many members and retired ANZ Officers from his service in the Bank, and specifically here in NSW when he was Manager Trade Finance International Division in the 1980's.

ANZ Executive Mark Monaghan said that several members will have known Ken Girvan who ran Trade in NSW in the mid/late 1980's.

He later ran ANZ Hong Kong before returning to Melbourne.

He passed away late last week after being in care consequent to suffering a stroke a few years ago. As Ray Brennan and I were observing when I just told him, Ken was both a very good operator and a terrific guy.

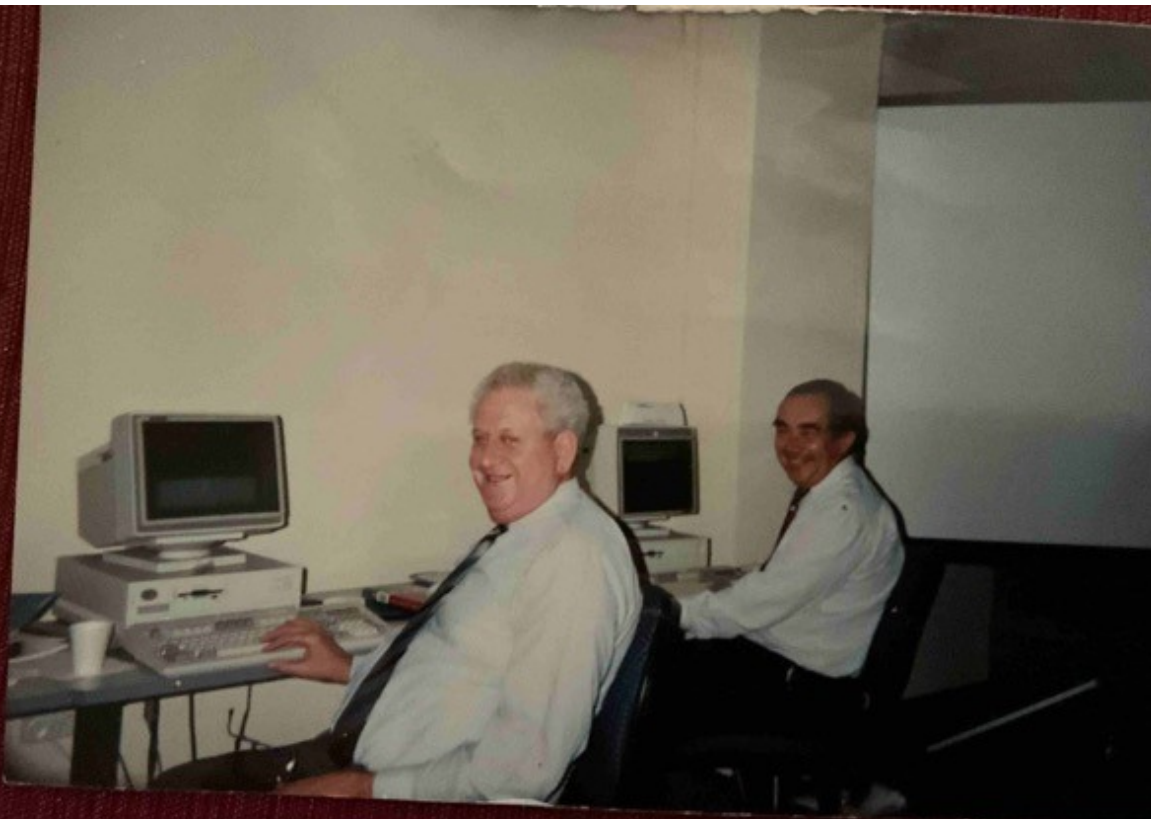

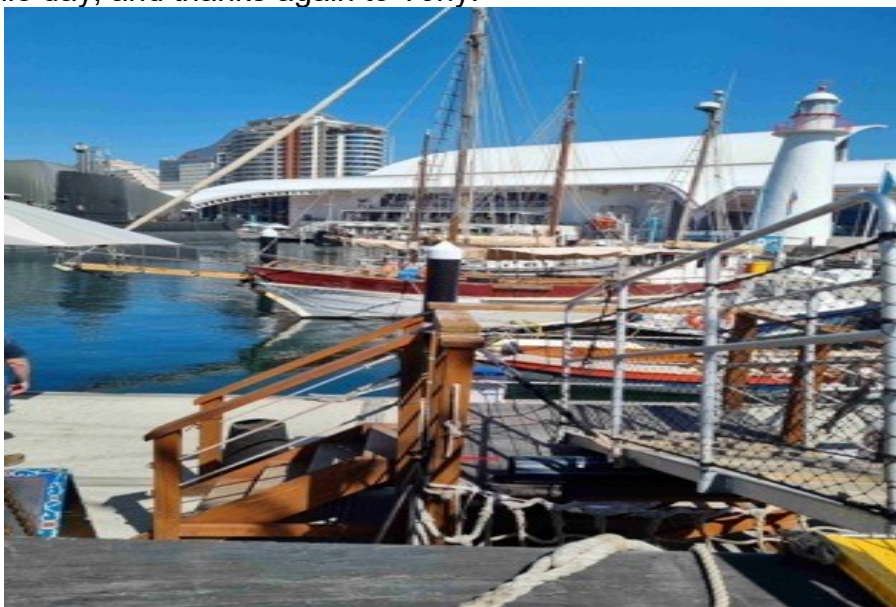

A very worthwhile day, and thanks again to Tony.



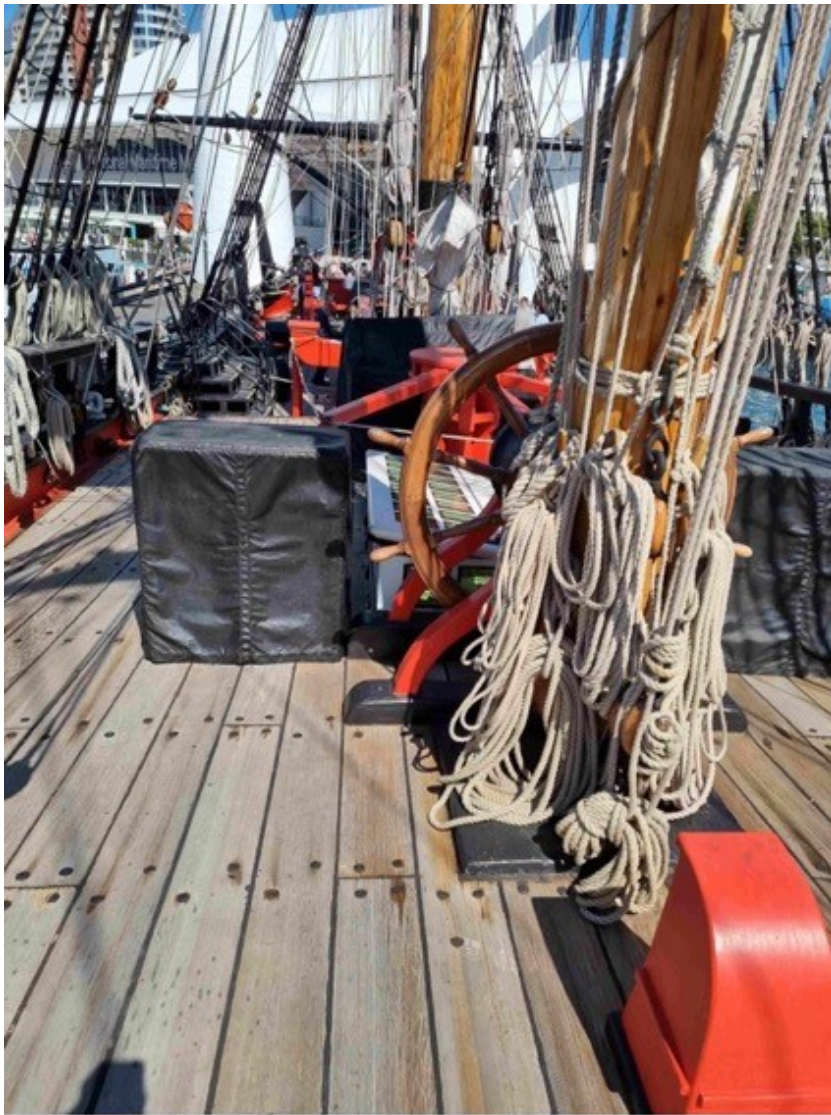
